The Cove is a transformative 90-unit affordable housing community for Veterans, including those experiencing homelessness. Located at Century Villages at Cabrillo in Long Beach, The Cove replaces outdated naval housing with modern, sustainable homes designed to foster stability and belonging.

Residents benefit from thoughtfully designed apartments, shared community spaces, and on-site supportive services that promote health, education, and connection. With its LEED Gold certification and accessibility features, The Cove reflects Century's commitment to creating lasting, inclusive solutions for Veterans.

Construction began in 2022 and concluded earlier this year.
